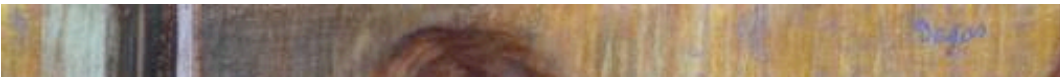

230,000 years ago, the form of a woman was found to be carved into a 1.4 inch volcanic red pebble, arguably representing the world's first work of art.





Perhaps more familiar to many of us than this Stone Age image are Edgar Degas' female bathers, painted in oils on canvas in the late 1800s.





Degas' exquisite images remain ever memorable, yet the paintings seem almost one-dimensional in comparison to what 21st Century technology offers, which has allowed multi-media artist Jane Martin the opportunity to create a series of masterful and unique works that place the nude female form in the midst of nature.
